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Summer Intern Positions Now Available!

Afognak Native Corporation (ANC) is pleased to announce that we are currently hiring two summer interns. **Summer Intern positions are open until filled.**

The ANC Summer Intern Program is designed to provide Interns with professional development opportunities and on-the-job work experience during the summer months. Interns are expected to work full-time (40 hours a week) over an 8 to 12 week period during the summer months. The number of weeks and the specific dates a summer intern works will be determined on a case-by-case basis to accommodate the interns' academic calendar. Summer Intern's can serve in one of the following departments: Accounting, Construction, Information Technology, Operations & Maintenance, Human Resources, Business Development, Lands, or Legal.

Students must maintain a grade point average of 2.0. Complete applications include a cover letter, intern application form, and resume.

SUMMER INTERN PROGRAM: POLICIES, GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES

Afognak Native Corporation (ANC) is administering the Summer Intern Program for the 2008 year. **SUMMER INTERN POSITIONS ARE OPEN UNTIL FILLED.**

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION / BACKGROUND

Afognak recognizes that a summer intern experience can be a valuable experience to a student's educational development, and strongly recommends that students take advantage of these opportunities. The Afognak Summer Intern program provides ANC Shareholders and Descendants that are going to school with work experience and an opportunity to explore career options. The program will be utilized to promote Shareholder hire.

WHO MAY APPLY

1. Voting Afognak Native Corporation Shareholders and their lineal descendants as defined by the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA) of 1971, including legally adopted children are eligible to apply to the intern program. (43 U.S.C.A. §1601).
2. Applicants must be an undergraduate or graduate college student enrolled full-time in a degree program.
3. *Qualified* employees who also meet all other requirements under "Who May Apply", are eligible.
4. To be eligible to apply for the intern program applicants must be a high school graduate or have a GED and be at least 18 years of age.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

1. Applicants may apply for an internship in the following departments: Accounting, Construction, Information Technology, Operations & Maintenance, Human Resources, Business Development, Lands, or Legal.
2. Each applicant must submit a completed Summer Intern application packet. Incomplete application packets will not be reviewed. Please note that the Summer Intern Program, the year-round Intern Program, HEP and CEO Scholarship Programs application processes are similar but that these are separate programs and require individual applications to be filled out for each one. *There are different deadlines for each program.*
3. A complete application packet includes the following:
 - a. Complete pages 1 – 4 of the Summer Intern application form. If questions do not apply, applicant should write "N/A" (not applicable);
 - b. Most recent high school or college official transcript (whichever is applicable). Students may submit an unofficial (copy) transcript; however, an official transcript is required at the beginning of the Summer Intern Program;
 - c. Applicants that are enrolled in college but have not yet started college classes must provide a letter of acceptance from his or her educational institution;
 - d. Cover letter;

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- e. Proof of eligibility:
 - i. If the applicant is an ANC shareholder, he or she must provide their own ANC shareholder identification number; or
 - ii. If the applicant is a descendant of a shareholder, provide the shareholder's identification number. If the applicant does not know the shareholder identification number the applicant may include a copy of the shareholder's birth certificate; and
 - f. Resume.
4. Applicants may contact ANC to ask for copies of their Summer Intern application, blank score sheet, blank rubric form, to contact the Intern Committee, or to make other inquiries.

 6. A Summer Intern applicant may also apply for Career Enhancement Opportunities (CEO) or Higher Education Program (HEP) funding during the same year.

REVIEW/SELECTION PROCESS

A Summer Intern Committee is responsible for selecting interns. Members of the Committee are named on the basis of their knowledge and interest in the educational and career development of Alaska Natives and familiarity with the opportunities available within ANC.

The Summer Intern Committee considers all information and completeness of applications. Selection is a competitive process as if applying for employment. The Committee scores each application in a variety of categories:

- neatness of application packet;
- scholastic achievement;
- cover letter; and
- interview with the Summer Intern Committee.

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
